Level 6 Assessment Guidance

Your 2,500 word process report for **RP3** is a report on a case example based on an 8-10 minute extract from a session. We're looking for evidence that you have been developing your capacity to think critically about your practice and to formulate cases.

You should:

- Explore and reflect upon your interventions, the reasons for them and their impact on the work
- Relate the client's present problems and patterns to their history and reflect on what this meant/means for the work with this client
- Make use of some theoretical material to support the links you've made between the client's present and their history
- Demonstrate that you are able to analyse and reflect on the processes that play out within and between you and your client.

Choosing your extract: While you might be tempted to choose an extract that shows your work in a good light, you may have more opportunity to demonstrate your learning/development if you choose an extract where something did not go as planned or where you feel you learned something particularly useful or important from the experience.

You don't need to analyse every moment featured in the extract, but do pull out a few specific examples to analyse them in some depth. Ensure you discuss how these fit into the broader process of the work and relationship with that client.

The **RP3** report is worth 50% of your mark for that module, with the rest being derived from your final case presentation.

The **RP3** report is an opportunity to consider your personal therapeutic style and the ways in which that manifests in your practice.

So you'll want to think about:

- How you would describe your theoretical orientation -- it is not enough to say 'integrative', you must outline what you are integrating and say what that means to you.
- You should describe your way of working in the room. Use brief examples and vignettes
 to demonstrate this if required but remember this piece is not a case study. As you paint
 a picture of your way of working, draw on the theoretical orientations you've outlined and
 expand on how these theoretical stances lead you to your way of working.

- As you expand on these points, use relevant opportunities to consider how self-awareness, working inclusively (difference) and ethical frameworks shape your work. You must touch on these areas because they are central to competent practice.
- You should give some examples of how supervision has influenced your work and how you've incorporated this.
